What is the Summer Slide?

You may have heard the term, but what does it mean?

"Summer Slide" is what happens when the skills students learn during the school year are lost or forgotten over the summer.

A great way to stop the "Summer Slide" is by participating in a **Summer Reading Program.**

A study by Dominican University found:

"Students who participated in the public library summer reading program **scored higher on reading achievement tests** at the beginning of the next school year than those students who did not participate and they gained in other ways as well.

"Teachers and public school librarians observed that students who participated in the public library summer reading program returned to school ready to learn, improved their reading achievement and skills, increased their enjoyment of reading, were more motivated to read, were more confident in participating in classroom reading activities, read beyond what was required in their free time, and perceived reading to be important."*

Lora O. Smith: Giving Forward



We recently had the opportunity to sit down with Lora O. Smith, San Marino resident, Crowell Public Library employee, library donor, library user and friend to ask a few questions about her generosity to include the San Marino Public Library Foundation in her gift planning.

Q: How did you first become involved with the Crowell Public Library?

I moved to San Marino in 1971 and in the early 1970's I obtained my library card to the San Marino Public Library. In the late 1980's, the library was looking for volunteers to insert security patches for the first security system, and I decided to volunteer. I was newly widowed and trying to decide what I wanted to do. A part time clerk position soon opened at the library and I was encouraged to apply for the position. I got the job and 29 years later I am still at the library. Today, I handle the library's acquisitions.

Q: Why did you become involved in the San Marino Public Library Foundation?

I was encouraged to serve on the Foundation board by the late City Librarian Carolyn Crain. The Foundation had just been established and I was a donor to the first campaign, Empty-A-Drawer. The Foundation was looking to expand its board with new members so I joined in 1997.

Q: Why do you think the San Marino Public Library Foundation's work is important?

The Foundation is important because it does more than fundraise. It plays an important public relations and advocacy role for the library to the residents and neighbors.

Through my will, I have designated an endowment to provide funding for materials, projects and programs as well as scholarships for library employees seeking advanced degrees in library technology and library related studies.

The capital project to build the current library building was a joint private and public endeavor. The City provided about a third of the total construction cost and took the responsibility to maintain the building going forward.

I hope the administrators of the endowment, who I envision to be the Foundation, will choose programs and projects that enhance library offerings outside of what the City will provide.

Q: Why did you include the San Marino Public Library Foundation in your estate plan?

At the time I made my will, I saw my family members were comfortable so I looked for a recipient that could use the help and know who I am. I made this decision prior to the capital campaign to build the current library building.

Q. How do you feel about your gift?

I am very pleased with my gift. The library draws from surrounding areas and serves multiple ethnicities. While the community has changed over the years, the children are all the same no matter their family backgrounds. The involvement of the children in Storytime will help all the family to love the library.

Q: Would you encourage others to include the San Marino Public Library Foundation in their estate plans?

Absolutely. These funds will be used to support the library. A larger endowment will only mean more programs and opportunities at the library. I don't think there will ever be too much money in the endowment. The greater the endowment, the more it can do.

I am privileged to live in San Marino.
I love my home and have no intention of leaving. Thanks to Dr.
Sam Smith I am here.
